We were very proud of the learners as they spoke with great confidence and enthusiasm and their rights using a variety of communication lessons. Jenny considered all of our evidence provided and the conversations she had with learners and staff and I am happy to inform you that she awarded up the Silver award for being a Rights Respecting School- Woohoo! Keep an eye out on the school grounds for our new Silver RRS banner which will be arriving soon along with our special RRS Silver certificate which we cannot wait to put up on display.

On Friday the 19th November we will be celebrating UNICEF's Universal children's day. A text had been sent home asking learners to wear something blue ready for a fun filled day of celebrating how amazing children are.
