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Experiential Phase

This week in school the wonderful Wallabies have been participating in lots of exciting activities surrounding our new story 'The Three Little Pigs'. We have been exploring straw/ wood and 'bricks' and creating collages for each of the pigs' houses. We have enjoyed exploring the 'touch' elements of the sensory book in order to gain a better understanding of the story. One learner has been using the ALD board in order to communicate the turning of the pages. We have been making pig / wolf masks using paper plates and using our switches to retell the story using key sentences. We really enjoyed using the fan "I'll huff

and I'll puff" (Wolf) and were able to anticipate the 'wind' once the activity had been repeated. We have used the nursery rhyme 'Hickory Dickory Dock' in order to introduce our new fortnightly letter sound 'T.....ick....T....ock...(repeat)...'accompanied with pendulum arm movements. The version that we found on the internet involves lots of different animals climbing up the clock and is really funny so perhaps check it out at home!?!?

Exploratory Phase

We've had something different this week! On Monday and Tuesday the Bikeability team visited school and supported learners to trial balance and pedal bikes. Some of the Exploratory learners from each class were chosen to engage in a session. I was thrilled to see Ellis, Ayaan S and Dylan take to pedal biking so quickly! It has also been shared that Danny H in Rhinos was amazing on a pedal bike, too, and is now enjoying riding a pedal bike daily on the playground; learning to riding slowly around other learners.

We continue with our themed and skills based learning this week. Ducklings have had a big focus on social skills this week; learning to play alongside their class friends. There was a lovely WOW moment where Theo and Frankie were able to share and enjoy the train set together.

All the other classes have shared some fantastic photos of skills-based learning themed with the celebration of Chinese New Year. Xinnián kuàilè!

Investigative Phase

What another fantastic week we have had in the Investigative phase. Our learners across all four classes have been busy celebrating Chinese New Year by taking part in lots of traditional activities.
