Exploratory Phase

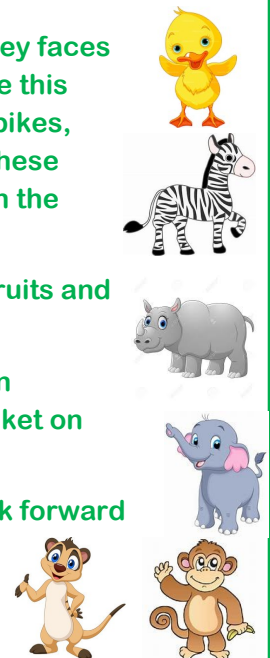
