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Experiential Phase

This week in school the wonderful Wallabies have been busy retelling the story of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' by way of role-playing. We have been bouncing different sized balls onto the big drum in order to make quiet / louder and loud sounds. We have been using our Tac Pac props (spatulas) in order to replicate the different sized goats trip trapping over the learner's shoulders. We have been striking different percussion instruments in order to join in with the focus story song. We have been practising our mark-making skills by using rollers to create a 'river' and printing with construction bricks to make a 'bridge'; as well as developing our fine motor skills by finger painting a troll mask. We have been developing our anticipation skills with the water spray ("SPLASH") and, also, rescuing the goats' farmyard friends from the cornflour gloop 'river'. We have put our new switches to good use and have been honing our cause-and-effect skills..... no need to stand up and activate the interactive whiteboard.....wireless technology.....MAGIC!!



Exploratory Phase

Another story-packed week in the Exploratory phase. Ducklings class have practiced spreading and pouring skills to make a snack for the 3 pigs. Zebras and Rhinos classes have taken their story-themed learning outside of the classroom this week, searching for the characters from the story along the path and in the wooded area. Elephants class have related their learning to a forest-themed week. Meerkats have been following instructions to make teddy bear biscuits. Monkeys have continued to use PODD ALD symbols effectively to talk about the next part of their focus story with Charlie Cook. Lots of great engagement across the phase this week!
