Investigative Phase

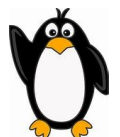
We've had a fantastic start to the term and welcomes staff members Gemma, Cassie, Natalie and Alex, Michelle and Lisa back to phase.

COVID RESTRICTIONS EXPLAINED



New restrictions to help stop the spread of COVID 19 are in place. There are different restrictions depending on where you live.

BOLTON



There is a ban on mixing outside households in homes and in public outdoor settings — enforceable by law. This means that:

- You must not host people you do not live with in your home or garden, unless they're in your support bubble
- You must not meet people you do not live with in their home or garden, whether inside or outside of Bolton, unless they're in your support bubble
- All hospitality for food and drink will be restricted to takeaway only
- Late-night restriction of operating hours, meaning venues will be required to close between 10pm and 5am

BURY MANCHESTER TRAFFORD OLDHAM TAMESIDE ROCHDALE SALFORD



- You must not meet people you do not live with inside a private home or garden, except where you have formed a support bubble (or for other limited exemptions to be specified in law).
- You must not visit someone else's home or garden even if they live outside of the affected areas.
- You must not socialise with people you do not live with in other indoor public venues – such as pubs, restaurants, cafes, shops, places of worship, community centres, leisure and entertainment venues, or visitor attractions. You may attend these venues with people you live with (or are in a support bubble with), but should avoid interaction with others. If you run such a business, you should take steps to ensure people do not interact with people they do not live with, in line with COVID-19 secure guidance.
- You must not visit friends or family in care homes, other than in exceptional circumstances. Care homes should restrict visits to these circumstances.

STOCKPORT WIGAN



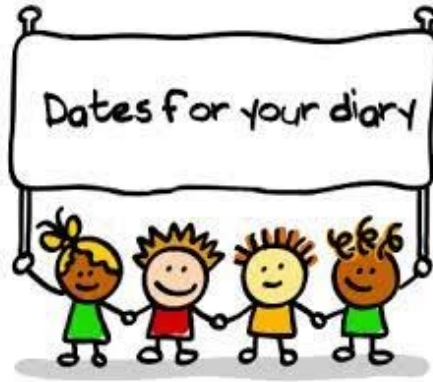
Local restrictions were lifted in Wigan on 26 August and for Stockport on 2 September.

People must not meet in groups of more than 6, if you do you will be breaking the law. Two households cannot meet if there would be more than 6 people. This will be the case inside or outside, in private homes, gardens or pubs.
