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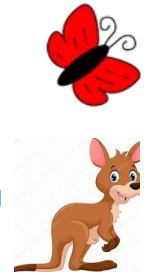

We have been dressing up as the beautiful swan from the story of 'The Ugly Duckling' and activating a switch to make the turkey from our 'Old Macdonald' story sing and dance to the 'Birdy song'; much to the annoyance of Debbie. Don't forget to join us for our virtual phase assembly today at 1.30pm.

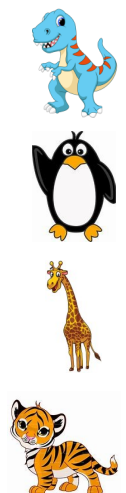


Investigative Phase
